Dangerous goods are articles or substances that are capable of posing a risk to health, safety, property to the environment.

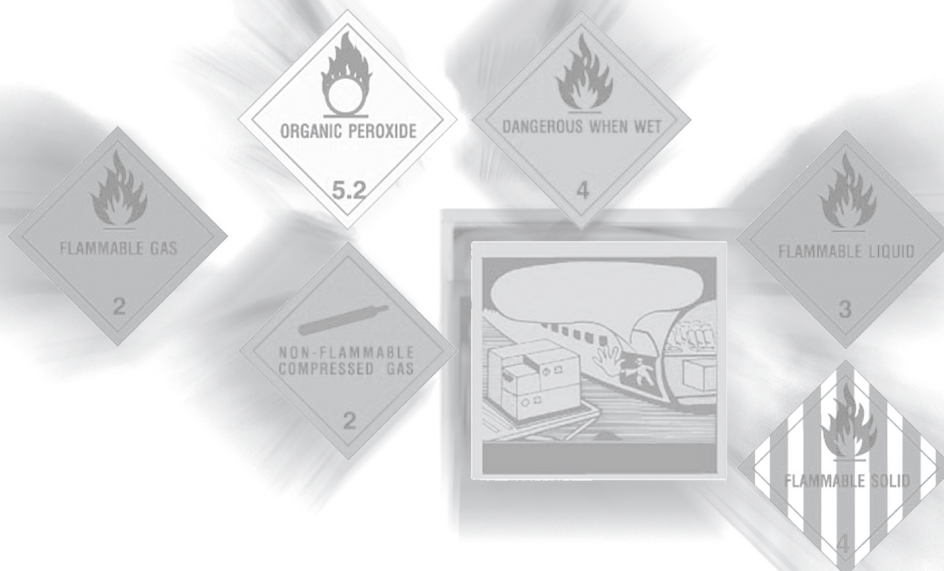
Dangerous goods can be transported safely by air transport provided certain principles are strictly followed, in compliance with iata dangerous goods regulations.

Shipper's responsibilities are the following:

- Establish that the articles or substances are not prohibited by air
- Ensure the articles or substances are properly identified, classified, marked, labelled, documented and in the condition for transport in accordance with these regulations.
- Verify that the dangerous goods are packaged in compliance with all applicable air transport requirements.
- Ensure that all dangerous goods consignments offered for transport are in full compliance with the regulations.
- Segregate dangerous goods contained in a consolidation from goods which are not subjected to these regulations and offer them separately.
- For all consignments, check documents and package exteriors for any indication or hidden hazards.

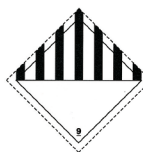
